

ABOUT YOUWECAN FOUNDATION

The **YouWeCan Foundation** (registered as Yuvraj Singh Foundation) is a non-profit organisation established by cricketer and cancer survivor **Yuvraj Singh**. The Foundation works with a mission to empower people to defeat cancer through awareness, early detection, patient support and survivor empowerment.



VISION

We envision an India empowered to defeat cancer.



MISSION

To empower all people to fight cancer, through awareness, early detection, patient support and survivor empowerment.



IMPACT METRICS

With an objective to create actionable awareness, we initiated our on-ground operations in 2012. We have been working and partnering with different organizations and communities across India. Through these operations, we have impacted over 3,29,150 lives, till date.

KEY INITIATIVES

Cancer Screening Program

We conduct regular screening camps for underprivileged communities in multiple location across the country and have screened over 150000 people till date. The program includes screening for breast and oral cancer. We plan to expand the program to include cervical cancer screening as well. Unfortunately, owing to the COVID-19 pandemic the screening activities had to be put on hold for the current fiscal year.

Cancer Awareness Program

We spread awareness on different types of cancer as well as on the importance of getting screened regularly, by leveraging various online and offline mediums.

Key focus areas include:

- Regular awareness camps are conducted in rural areas with a focus on oral, breast & cervical cancer awareness in addition to providing tobacco-cessation counselling.
- Anti-tobacco workshops are conducted in schools and colleges in different parts of the country
- Awareness workshops and events are conducted around the year in corporate offices, residential complexes, community centres, shopping complexes and hospitals in different parts of the country.



YWC Cancer Treatment Fund

The YouWeCan Cancer Treatment Fund for Paediatric Patients provides financial assistance for the treatment of eligible cancer patients, to a maximum limit of Rs. 3,00,000.00 (Rupees Three Lakhs) per patient. Only patients below the age of 18 years, who belong to underprivileged backgrounds, having an annual household income of Rs.2 lakhs are supported under this fund.

YWC Scholarship for Cancer Survivors

Through this program we help cancer survivor students get reintegrated into the formal education system, by providing scholarships up to Rs.30,000 per student per year.

Only students belonging to underprivileged backgrounds, having an annual household income of Rs.2 lakhs are supported under this initiative. Once a student is enrolled, they are supported each year till the time they complete their education.

Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and most schools shut, we could support the education of 17 beneficiaries for the current financial year.

CANCER AWARENESS

The key to saving many more lives from cancer lies in educating people about cancer prevention techniques, the importance of getting screened regularly for cancer and the signs and symptoms of cancer.

Due to the ongoing pandemic, we took our awareness campaigns online through social media and webinars. Multiple sessions and activities were conducted throughout the year to spread awareness.

Some of the key events included:







Mission Nutrition

On 26th September 2020, an interactive webinar with Nutritionist Sahiba B on diet modifications for cancer prevention was conducted. The session covered extensively how over time our diets have a major component of processed foods and how natural ingredients present in our kitchens have amazing properties that help reduce the risk of cancers.

Let's Talk Breast Cancer

On 30th October 2020, an informative webinar was held on understanding Breast Cancer. During this zoom webinar, Surgical Oncologist Dr. Sumeet Shah talked about the prevention, treatment modalities & myths around breast cancer. Moreover, the journey as a patient and survivor was shared by Ms. Ujwala Raje, who is a food technologist, as well as by Ms. Poonam Nanda, founding member of YouWeCan Foundation who not only shared her journey of fighting breast cancer twice but also moderated the session.

International Women's Day

Team YouWeCan, in association with the office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police (Dwarka District), organized an awareness session on Breast Cancer by Dr. Pallavi Shukla, Asst. Prof. Preventive Oncology, AIIMS New Delhi, was organized for the Police Families Welfare Society. The ladies were extremely grateful for the insights shared during the session.

CANCER TREATMENT FUND

The YouWeCan Cancer Treatment Fund for Pediatric Patients provides financial assistance for the treatment of eligible cancer patients, to a maximum limit of Rs. 3,00,000.00 (Rupees Three Lakhs) per patient. Only patients belonging to underprivileged backgrounds, who are below 18 years of age, are eligible to receive support under the fund.

The entire cost of treatment of shortlisted patients is supported, as per the treatment plan of the hospital, including (but not limited to) diagnostic tests, investigations, chemotherapy, radiation therapy, surgery, and cost of medication. All medical services related to the treatment are provided directly by the partner hospital. YouWeCan Foundation's role is limited to providing financial aid to support the cost of treatment.


Under the program we partner with eminent hospitals across the country, which have state of the art facilities for medical oncology, surgical oncology, and radiation oncology. Partner hospitals further extend their support to this initiative, by providing a 100% waiver of room rent charges and doctor's consultancy fees.

Since the Foundation began its operations, we have partnered with 17 hospitals across the country and the treatment of 83 beneficiaries has been supported under this program till 31st March 2021.

In the year 2020-2021 we spent around Rupees 76 lakhs and supported the treatment of 48 beneficiaries at partner hospitals across India.



With each passing day this program is growing and achieving new heights with more and more hospitals being added to the partner lists along with more donor partnerships thereby increasing our reach to a greater number of beneficiaries.



SUPPORTING INDIA'S FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19

YouWeCan Foundation begins each year with high hopes and spirits with an aim to outnumber the target beneficiaries from previous years, thereby bringing us one step closer to our vision and mission.

However, the current year started with a nationwide lockdown and uncertainty as nobody knew or was prepared for what the future held.

Realizing the need for an immediate action, we sprang into action and collaborated with Paytm and Lifebuoy to launch the #IndiaFightsCorona Initiative which raised Rs. 1.8 Crores to provide 1 million hygiene kits to 16 state governments for the frontline healthcare workers.





Swaraj Amol Gadhave Pune, Maharashtra

At the young age of 5 years, Swaraj was diagnosed with Acute Myeloblastic Leukemia. His treatment, which included chemotherapy and supportive care, lasted for over 8 months. Belonging to a marginalized section of society, the combined household income of his father, then a painter, and his mother, a daily wage farm worker, was a combined amount of Rs. 80,000 per year.

As a result of the emotional repercussions on the family, the father separated from Swaraj's mother and abandoned them. To add to this, Swaraj's mother was being pressured by relatives and neighbors to stop his cancer treatment as he may not survive, and all the money would go to waste.

Being a mother, Sunita refused to give in to the pressure and stood by her son as a pillar of strength and hope. She was confident that her son would defeat cancer and have a healthy and happy childhood. She struggled hard and somehow managed to arrange for the funds for his treatment, by borrowing money from relatives and taking the support of NGOs. She recalls her toughest days when she had to leave for work and Swaraj stayed in the hospital all alone for several hours, often in great pain.

Once his treatment was successfully completed, Sunita faced the next daunting task of not being able to pay his school fees and decided to keep him at home. At this point, she found out about Yuvraj Singh Foundation's YouWeCan Scholarship for Cancer Survivors.

The team at the foundation guided her through the application process and after all the necessary due diligence procedures were complete, Swaraj's application was approved, and he was awarded the scholarship. Today, Swaraj is leading the life of a healthy child who is fond of academics and loves making friends. Pursuing his schooling at the Sant Tukaram English Medium School & Jr. College – Pune in 2nd grade, his teachers are thrilled to see the talent and infectious positive energy he brings to the class.

Swaraj dreams of becoming a doctor and shares his story of fighting cancer with many others, to inspire them and give them hope.





Satwik Kumar Singh Hazaribagh, Jharkhand

Satwik would often have bruises on his legs and arms. Assuming that these were a result of him being mischievous in school, his parents visited the school to enquire about the same. However, it was found that Satwik had never been involved in any fights with his classmates, but was rather adored by them.

To add to this, one day Satwik developed an acute fever accompanied by cold and cough, which did not settle despite medication. On further probing, diagnosis and tests, it was found that he was suffering from Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. In 2009, Satwik underwent critical treatment for this at the Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. With an annual income of Rs. 78,000, his parents had to borrow money from their neighbors to fund Satwik's treatment.

Satwik was forced to miss out on school while he was undergoing his treatment which included chemotherapy and supportive care. Unfortunately, the school made his family pay an excessive amount to ensure his name stays enrolled in the school which promised premium education.

During this difficult phase, Satwik's family reached out to multiple NGOs to ensure that this tough phase of his life did not define his capabilities and prospects. They were finally referred to Yuvraj Singh Foundation's YouWeCan Scholarship for Cancer Survivors which is now completely funding Satwik's education.

Today, Satwik is happily pursuing his academics in 5th grade at Delhi Public School, Hazaribagh.

Despite facing cancer at such an early age,

Satwik has undergone his treatment with tremendous courage. Being one of the brightest students in his class, he aspires to become a scientist one day.

Having experienced this deadly disease, Satwik wants children like him to never to lose hope and be positive no matter what life throws at them.





Ayesha Khatun Birbhum, West Bengal

The child of humble farmers, 4 year old Ayesha lives in a town on the outskirts of West Bengal. Worries for her family began very early into Ayesha's life. At 2, the little girl started feeling exhausted and suffered from acute pain. Upon conducting regular tests, the general physician could not make an accurate diagnosis. Meanwhile, Ayesha's health had already started deteriorating. She was unable to eat or retain food. Her skin developed a yellow tinge, and she began to faint frequently. Her father, Shaikh Firoz Hasan had to rush to hospitals to get her blood — every time the girl fainted.

On October 28, 2017, young Ayesha was diagnosed with T-cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia. This aggressive type of cancer progresses quickly, making it a painful diagnosis. As the family ran from one hospital to the next, they were recommended to Saroj Gupta Cancer Hospital as Ayesha's condition continued to develop complications. The treatment cost given by her oncologist was approximately INR 6 lacs. Her parents had a meagre annual income of INR 30,000. They sold their gold, land and other assets that would help them in raising funds, and went on to borrow money from relatives. Despite all these efforts, there was no relief for her family as they still fell short on paying the medical bills. After a period of time, Ayesha's parents expressed their inability to continue with the treatment due to lack of funds. In addition to their struggle — the pandemic presented them with new obstacles to overcome. The family was unable to access medical assistance due to the lockdown imposed. It was at this point, that YouWeCan came to Ayesha's aid. The foundation got in touch with local authorities and helped Ayesha access the help she needed.

Her father was assured that the foundation would take care of the entire expense of her treatment. Ayesha underwent multiple rounds of chemotherapy and started responding well to the treatment After bearing countless needle pricks and facing her challenges head on — Ayesha seems to be recovering well. Her parents plan to enroll her to a school nearby, once the doctors give her the green signal.

Ayesha's parents had to fight two battles; one against the deadly cancer that invades the body and the other one which invades mind — the battle against gender discrimination in our society. Despite having no savings and unstable sources of income, they never thought of giving up on Ayesha. Inspired by the doctor who held her hand throughout her treatment, Ayesha now dreams of becoming a doctor when she grows up. We appreciate Ayesha's fighting spirit and we also applaud the grit and determination of the parents who left no stone unturned to get their daughter back on her feet.



Parteek Kadian Dubaldhan, Haryana

The apple of his parents' eye, 15-year-old Parteek is a bright young boy from Dubaldhan, Haryana. The only child of farmers with an annual income less than INR 2 lacs – Surjeet and Meenu is loved and pampered by everyone. The family was living happily until one day when they came to know that their son was diagnosed with a type of non-hodgkin lymphoma called Lymphoblastic Lymphoma which is a cancer of immature lymphocytes.

The trouble began with Parteek's severe cough which didn't stop even after taking the prescribed medicines. After a while, the local doctor suggested they get a CT scan in Hisar – the nearest city from Dubaldhan. The scan showed a scary picture with knots in the chest. The very next day, the family packed their bags and came to Rajiv Gandhi Cancer Institute, Delhi to begin Parteek's treatment.

But this was just the beginning. From August 2019 to March 2020, Parteek went through 17 painful rounds of chemotherapy. There were times when his health became very critical as he could not stop vomiting, had consistent fever and diarrhea. Through this, his weight dropped to 32 kgs.

When it comes to their own child's health, even the bravest of the people get scared and paranoid. Which parent can really see their innocent child facing such pain and fatigue? However, Parteek is an extremely strong child. Not even for once, the young lad complained and co-operated during the ups and downs of the treatment. He prayed with his mother. His mother tells us how disciplined and punctual he was in following the doctor's recommendations. For instance, he would have his medicine sharp at 9:00 am without fail, and never at 9:02

am, since the doctor had prescribed to take it at that time.

Today, Parteek is doing much better than before. He has moved back to his town after completing treatment in Delhi. He loves studying and will be appearing for his 10th standard board exams in Kuldeep Singh Memorial Public School, Jhajjar.

Parteek wants to add doctor salutation to his name and dreams of being called Dr Kadian when he grows up. His family feels indebted to the doctors in RGCI not only for giving the right treatment, but also recommending them to Yuvraj Singh Foundation for financial and emotional support.



Ever since COVID-19 came to India and the sudden lockdown was announced, migrant laborers and daily wagers have suffered the most. We all saw how thousands of them started walking towards their hometowns due to a lack of any income source in the cities.

To help alleviate their suffering, in the first week of April 2020, our volunteers at Nizamabad in Telangana took matters into their own hands and distributed ration kits to 120 families as well as food parcels to 500 underprivileged & migrant workers for 14 days regularly.







COVID-19 Relief

As a part of COVID-19 relief initiatives in mid-April 2020, our super active team of volunteers reached out to the Police Commissioner of Nizamabad Police and handed over Masks, Gloves, Sanitizers & PPE Kits for 2000 police officers working 24x7 during COVID times and risking their lives to safeguard the residents of the city.





National Doctor's Day

India celebrates National Doctor's Day on 1st July, which is the birth anniversary of Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, an eminent physician, academician, freedom fighter and politician. Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy was the first Chief Minister of West Bengal after India gained Independence. He was awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1961. This year, the National Doctor's Day was very significant as doctors continued to fight the Covid pandemic day and night. To honor their selfless spirit, our volunteers facilitated 15 doctors for their undying efforts in COVID wards in the city of Nizamabad.





New Year Celebrations

We welcomed the New Year 2021 celebrating with the pediatric cancer patients admitted at the Super Speciality Pediatric Hospital & Post Graduate Teaching Institute, Noida.



International Women's Day

On this day in 2021 we celebrated the undying spirit of pediatric oncology social workers across India who are working tirelessly on the ground and staying away from their families to serve cancer patients during tough times of COVID-19. This was done by engaging with them in a fun casual call over zoom and sharing their experiences with our online audience and spreading the word of these frontline warriors.







World Cancer Day

World Cancer Day, held every year on 4th February, is a global initiative led by the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC). By raising worldwide awareness, improving education and catalysing personal, collective and government action, we are all working together to reimagine a world where millions of preventable cancer deaths are saved and access to life-saving cancer treatment and care is equitable for all - no matter who you are or where you live. Created in 2000, World Cancer Day has grown into a positive movement for everyone, everywhere to unite under one voice to face one of our greatest challenges in history.







On 4th February 2021, our volunteers at Hyderabad visited the oncology ward at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad and spent some time interacting with the patients so as to motivate them in their fight against cancer. The volunteers also distributed fruits and stationary kits to the 90 patients admitted in the ward.

World Cancer Day

A cricket tournament on World Cancer Day was organized by volunteers at Shoolini University. This tournament was inaugurated by honorable chancellor Mr. PK Khosla & Pro Vice Chancellor Mr. Atul Khosla. A total of 10 teams fought for the winner's title. A huge passion was seen amongst all the participating teams and the energy kept building up throughout the tournament. In the final match of the tournament, YouWeCan Eleven and Shoolini Eleven fought for the Champion's title.

The tournament was won by YouWeCan Eleven. "The winners of the tournament", "man of the match" of the final match and "man of the tournament" players were awarded with trophies, medals, and bats and balls signed by our Founder Mr. Yuvraj Singh. Also, all the participants of the final match were given YouWeCan T-shirts signed by Mr. Yuvraj Singh. A total of 121 teachers and 33 students were present during this tournament.





On 7th February 2021, an online talk on cancer awareness was organized. This talk was named "A to Z of Being Cancer Smart". In this talk, the speaker was cancer super specialist Dr. Puneet Gupta. He is the Director of Oncology Services at Metro Hospital and Cancer Center, New Delhi. Shoolini University volunteers organized this webinar on fundamentals of cancer to create awareness and support for early detection, treatment, and palliative care of this disease. He expressed how 30 to 50 percent of cancer can be avoided simply through healthier lifestyle decisions. The audience listened to this talk with a great amount of focus. More than 630 people joined this webinar.





International Childhood Cancer Day

15th February is International Childhood Cancer Day. It is a global collaborative campaign to raise awareness about childhood cancer and to express support for children and adolescents with cancer, the survivors, and their families.

To do their bit, our Nizamabad volunteers visited one of our partner hospitals under our YWC Cancer Treatment Fund, Basvatarakam Indo American Cancer Hospital & Research Institute, Hyderabad and distributed coloring books, soft toys, fruits, etc. to 55 pediatric patients admitted in the ward.


