

Swasth Mahila Swasth Bharat: Empowering Women, One District at a Time

In collaboration with Xiaomi India, the Swasth Mahila Swasth Bharat project is making a life-changing difference in 15 districts across 15 states by raising breast cancer awareness and offering screenings. Here's a glimpse of the impact we're making in each district:

- Nuh, Haryana: In this vibrant community, we've connected with 628 women, providing crucial breast health education. Screening has begun, with over 261 women already taking a step towards early diagnosis.
- Moga, Punjab: The spirit of resilience is alive here, with 492 women educated on breast cancer, and over 306 already screened. Moga is becoming a shining example of the power of awareness.
- Baran, Rajasthan: Energy is high in Baran, where we've reached 1,341 women with breast health education. Over 188 women have been screened, and the district is proving that awareness paired with action can truly save lives.
- Guna, Madhya Pradesh: In Guna, we're gearing
 up to launch extensive awareness campaigns,
 with offline training scheduled to equip our team
 for impactful screenings that will change lives in
 this region.
- Dahod, Gujarat: Anticipation is building as we prepare to bring awareness and screenings to this district. With training set for this month, we're on the verge of creating lasting change here.
- Udham Singh Nagar, Uttarakhand: Over 2,088
 women have already been empowered through
 awareness sessions, and with 478+ women
 screened, Udham Singh Nagar is setting an
 example of what education and action can
 accomplish.
- Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh: We've reached 1,170 women, arming them with life-saving knowledge about breast cancer prevention. Screening drives have already impacted over 267 women, showcasing the ripple effect of early detection.







- Osmanabad, Maharashtra: Preparations are underway, with training scheduled this month to kick-start awareness and screening efforts in this district. Osmanabad is ready to join the fight against breast cancer.
- Kalaburagi, Karnataka: Offline training is planned for this month to equip our team, who will soon begin spreading knowledge and offering screenings to the women of Kalaburagi.
- Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh: In Visakhapatnam, 808 women have been educated, and over 222 women screened. The district is making significant strides in advocating for early detection.
- Khammam, Telangana: Leading the charge, Khammam has empowered 2,216 women and screened 336+ individuals. The district is an inspiring example of how communities can unite to prioritize health.
- Barpeta, Assam: With training scheduled for this month, Barpeta will soon be at the forefront of breast cancer awareness and screening, ready to make a lasting impact.
- Nadia, West Bengal: Nadia is next, with offline training planned. Soon, we'll be reaching women across the district, ensuring that no one is left behind in the fight against breast cancer.
- Virudhunagar, Tamil Nadu: With 220 women already educated, Virudhunagar is gearing up for screenings, empowering every woman to take charge of her health.
- Wayanad, Kerala: In the beautiful hills of Wayanad, we've educated 496 women, with 73+ screened. This district is proof of the power of community-driven health initiatives.

Together with Xiaomi India, we are transforming lives one district at a time, empowering women to prioritize their health. The Swasth Mahila Swasth Bharat journey is ongoing, and every step brings us closer to a future where early detection saves lives.









Survivor Story

My son's name is Oliver and we are from Jhansi. He is 11 years old. A few months ago, our world turned upside down when Oliver started complaining of severe pain in his leg. As a parent, you always fear the worst but hope it's something minor. However, after visiting the doctor and undergoing several tests, including a biopsy, we received devastating news—Oliver was diagnosed with Ewing sarcoma, a rare type of cancer that affects the bones.

As a mother, hearing the word 'cancer' connected to your child shakes your very soul. We felt lost, scared, and overwhelmed. We knew we had to fight, but it was hard to see how we would manage everything—both emotionally and financially. Our journey for treatment began at RGCI Hospital in Rohini, Delhi, where we have been receiving care for the past 5 to 6 months. The doctors and nurses have been a huge support, and we've seen Oliver's courage shine through every treatment session, every test, and every challenge.

However, despite the hospital's efforts, we were faced with another daunting obstacle—funding. The cost of cancer treatment is enormous, and we were struggling to make ends meet. It was during this difficult time that we learned about YouWeCan, Yuvraj Singh's foundation, through the hospital. They have been a beacon of hope for us. With their assistance, we were able to continue Oliver's treatment without worrying about the financial burden. I cannot express in words how much this support has meant to us.

I want to extend my deepest gratitude to YouWeCan the Yuvraj Singh Foundation, and Yuvraj Singh himself. Their generosity has given Oliver the chance to continue his treatment and has brought hope back into our lives. We will always be grateful for the help we received and for the love and support that surrounded us during these trying times.




