

Empowering Women's Health: SMSB Unveils Phase 2, Breaking Barriers for Breast Health Access

Phase 2 of the Swasth Mahila Swasth Bharat's Gurugram chapter kicked off as women returned from their Diwali celebrations in the villages. A significant focus was directed towards mobilizing women, aiming to eradicate the stigma hindering them from prioritizing breast health. The joint efforts of Agrasar team members and YWC deployed three screening machines across Sikanderpur, Sarhaul, and Devilal, educating and screening numerous women, resulting in the identification of potential cases.

Moving forward, all suspected cases are diligently followed up to ensure comprehensive diagnostics have ruled out carcinoma. To ease financial constraints for our beneficiaries, YWC collaborated with Charitable Hospitals, providing free ultrasonography for suspected cases.

December marks our return to the communities we've educated, bringing doorstep breast cancer screenings and engaging in personalized counseling sessions. We aim to address their challenges concerning breast health and navigate them through the healthcare system for further testing if needed.












YouWeCan's Heartfelt Diwali Celebration at AIIMS Brings Light to Little Lives




Radiant Hope: YouWeCan & Smiths Group Illuminate Sri Shankara Cancer Hospital with Joy and Inspiration!




YouWeCan Virtual Session Sparks Action Against Oral Cancer for NatWest Employees

Survivor Story

I am an ordinary man who works at a mobile shop. Our lives changed drastically when our four-year-old son Anshit got a high fever that lasted for several days. The local hospital tests showed a serious problem, so we went to PGICH in Noida for a bone marrow test. The diagnosis was blood cancer, and with this news our lives were turned upside down. We had to sell our house to pay for Anshit's treatment.

In the midst of this difficult time, we received unexpected help from Yuvraj Singh's Foundation. They gave us support and hope. Anshit's treatment began on March 13th, and we knew we were in for a long and though fight. Every 15 days, we would get a call from the hospital, a grim reminder of the reality we were facing.

It was heartbreaking to see our young son go through such a difficult treatment. I couldn't even send him to school. Yuvraj Singh's foundation became a source of strength and love for us. The hospital reports were a temporary relief, but they didn't change the fact that we were facing a major crisis.

We knew we had two more years of treatment ahead of us. Despite the uncertainty, we never gave up. His mother was a pillar of strength for our entire family.She went through sleepless nights and sacrifices. She showed us what it means to be strong when faced with adversity. We are so grateful to Yuvraj Singh's foundation and for the support that has helped us through this difficult time.

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Myth Busters



Myth 1: HIV is a death sentence

Fact: Since 1996, with the advent of highly active, antiretroviral therapy, a person with HIV with good access to antiretroviral therapy (ART) can expect to live a normal life span, so long as they take their prescribed medications.

Myth 2: You can tell if someone has HIV/AIDS by looking at them

Fact: If an individual contracts the HIV virus, the symptoms are largely unremarkable. A person with an HIV infection might display symptoms that are similar to any other type of infection, such as a fever, fatigue, or general malaise. Additionally, the initial mild symptoms generally only last a few weeks.





Myth 3: HIV can be transmitted through mosquito bites

Fact: HIV cannot be transmitted by mosquitoes. The virus is not present in sufficient quantities in mosquito saliva, and it is primarily transmitted through direct human-to-human contact.
